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Early Intervention Program and Integrated Pre-School Program

We have worked with children with special needs in a group setting as well as on one to one setting at home and at early learning center.

We believed that every child is unique and with continuous support from parents, teachers, and therapists we can work together towards their optimum independence in their self-help skills, improve their motor skills, language & communication skills and social interactions.

Structured Play

This program is based on a “play with purpose”, it’s any activity that offers a specific learning outcomes. Structured play can take many forms, it can be physical or mental activities that teaches children new skills. But it wasn’t all formal or organized, kids can have some fun while learning.

What we do?

Special Needs Resource Specialist and will observe the child and discuss needs to family

Together with family, Early Childhood Educators, and Early Literacy specialist will create an individualized plan and set goals for each child

Establish a structured play for kids to learn and at them same time have fun

Create a learning space for children such as sensory play, dramatic area, reading corner, math and science area

What children learn?

Establish their routine skills

Follow and understand simple directions

Enhanced their social interactions and play skills

Develop their creativity and imagination

Improved their fine motor skills through arts and crafts

Concepts such as color, size, sequences, numbers, letters and shapes

Encourage them to move through rhythm and movement during circle time

Develop their independence with their self-help skills like washing hands, opening snack container, zipping their jackets, etc

School Readiness Program

This program focuses on teaching children about routines, self-help skills, following directions, identifying and recognizing basic concepts like shapes, colors, letters and numbers, and help develop their motor skills and social interactions

What we do?

Special Needs Resource Specialist will observe the child and discuss needs to family

Together with family, Early Childhood Educators, Early Literacy Specialists and Special Needs Resource Specialist will create an individualized plan and set goals for each child

Workshops will be provided to families to help support the child at home

Teachers will coach and demonstrate activities to be practiced at home

Children will be divided appropriately into small groups according to their needs and skills; 3:1 ratio (3 kids with 1 Early Childhood Educator)

Written report will be given to the family at the end of each session highlighting the goals achieved and skills that needs more improvement

What Children Learn?

Understanding and following routines

Enhance their social skills and play skills

Improve their fine motor skills needed for holding the pencils well, writing and coloring

Develop their gross motor skills needed for active play such as jumping, climbing, crawling, etc

Encouraged to use words in expressing their needs and wants

Identify and recognize basic concepts like letters, numbers, colors & shapes
